

## Single Crochet (US)/Double crochet (UK)

## Single/double crochet

Single crochet (US) and double crochet (UK) are the same stitches. You will usually be told when following a pattern which terms are being used, but on the odd occasion that you aren't, if single crotchet is mention then US terms will be used.

Single crotchet is seen abbreviated as SC and double crochet is seen abbreviated as DC.

## SC/DC in rows

As you will find which you start to following patterns, $\mathrm{sc} / \mathrm{dc}$ can be crocheted into rows.

When working in rows you will turn at the end of the row. After completing the last row you will need to turn your work and chain 1. You will then skip the first $\mathrm{sc} / \mathrm{dc}$ as pictured below.

Single Crochet

When following a pattern it will tell you how many chains to start with, as you can see below we have ch 16


You will then need to start your sc/dc into the stitch indicated below.


You will then sc/dc into each chain to the end. You will have $15 \mathrm{sc} / \mathrm{dc}$.
