

## Half Double Crochet (US)/Half Treble crochet (UK)

## Half double/half treble

Half double crochet (US) and half treble crochet (UK) are the same stitches. You will usually be told when following a pattern which terms are being used, but on the odd occasion that you aren't, if single crotchet is mention then US terms will be used.

Half Double crotchet is seen abbreviated as HDC and Half Treble crochet is seen abbreviated as HTR.





## HDC/HTR in rows

As you will find which you start to following patterns, HDC/HTR can be crocheted into rows.

When working in rows you will turn at the end of the row. After completing the last row you will need to turn your work and chain 2. You will then skip the first HDC/HTR as pictured below.





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When following a pattern it will tell you how many chains to start with, as you can see below we have ch 17



You will then need to start your hdc/htr into the stitch indicated below. These skipped stitched will be treated as the first hdc/htr.



You will then hdc/htr into each chain to the end. You will have 15 hdc/htr.
