Below are some picture tutorials on how to make a starting chain, if you are following a pattern it will tell you how many you will need to make. You may see chain abbreviated as CH.

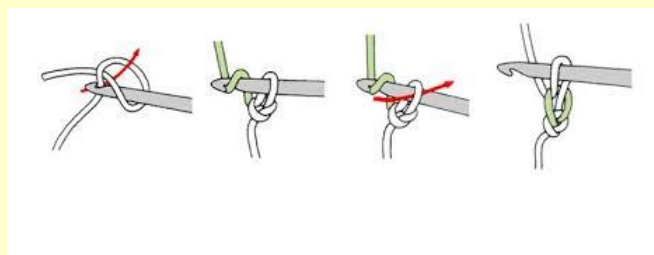
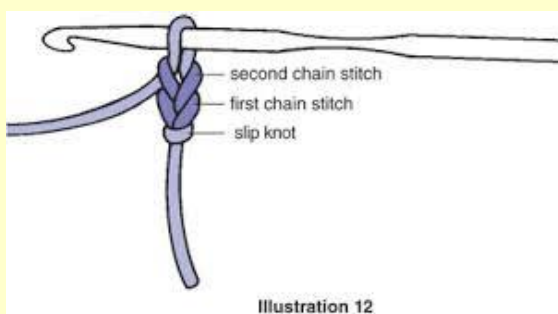
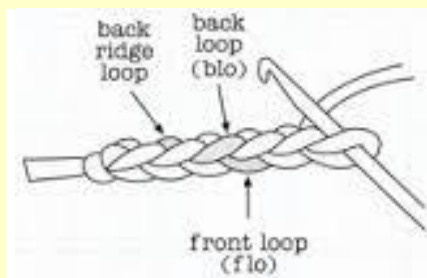

### Magic Circle

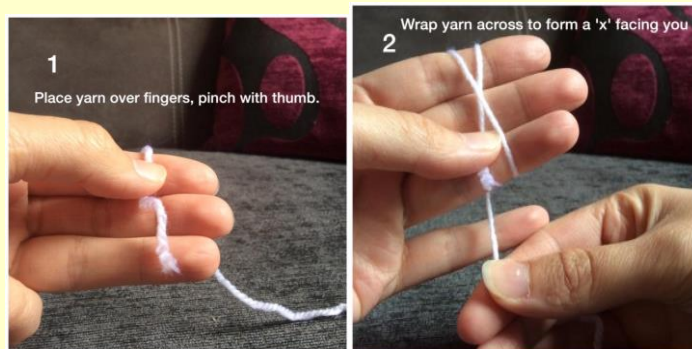
An alternative to chaining at the beginning of a pattern you may be asked to use a magic circle, you may see this abbreviated as MC.

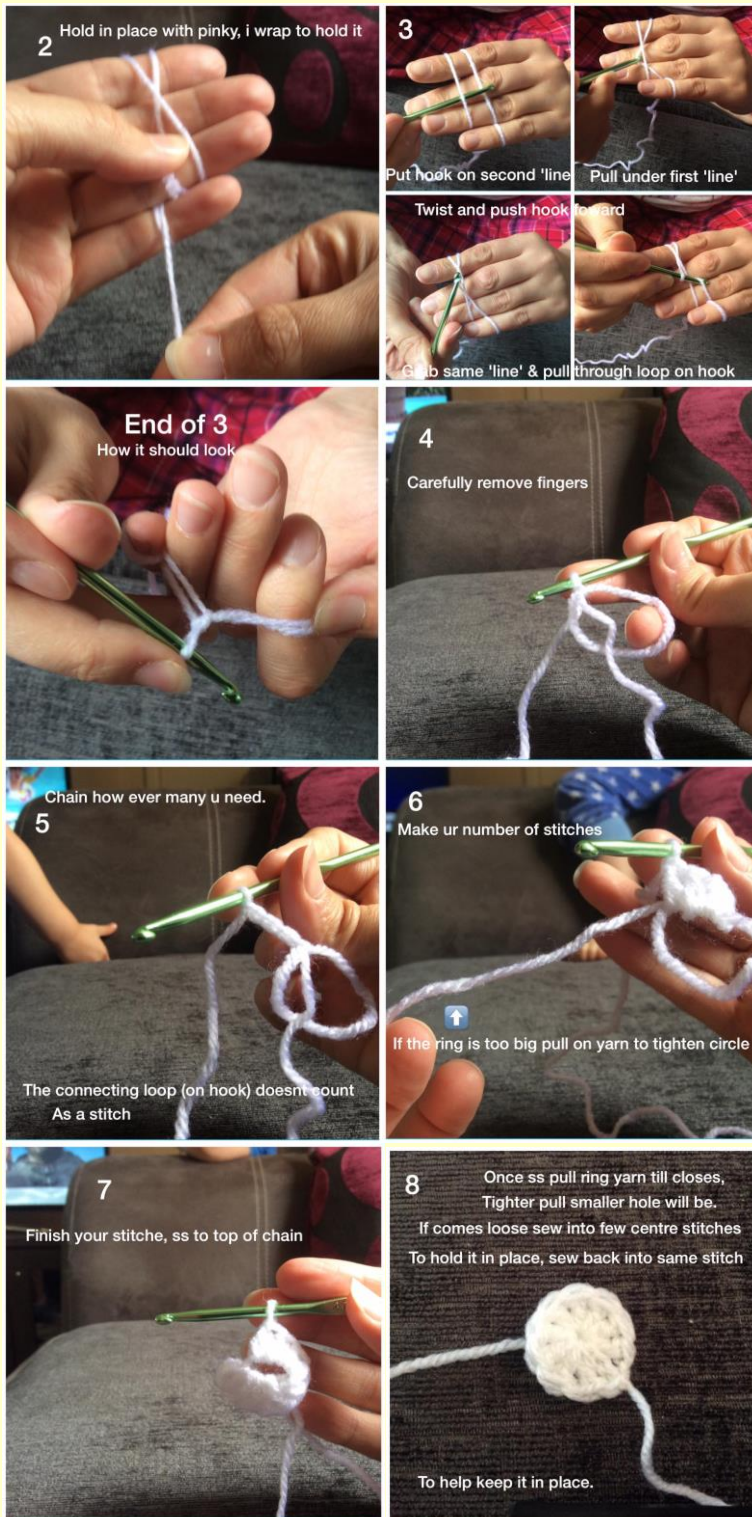
